Meeting held at the Consumers Power Co. office on the Ludington Pump Storage Plant site at 10:00 A.M; also present were William Reid of the Consumers Power Co., E. H. beil, D. D. Johnson, C. C. Meader and a Mr. Shuritz all with Consumers Power Co; also Jim Ferguson of Detroit Edison Co., and Robert Mitchel and Robert Polvi of the Ebasco Engineering Contractors. At this time, the following subjects were discussions.

- I. Chauvez Road re-grading from US-31, west, to the private haul road to the Pump Storage site, a distance of approx. I.8 miles; the Mason County Road Commission is to secure bids as soon as possible for the grading of approx. I.2 miles of ti Chauvez Rd. starting from US-31 west. Cost of this grading and the necessary aggregate surfacing to be paid for by the Consumers Power Co.
- 2. To permit unrestricted grading on the Chauvez Rd., present Class "A" truck haulwill be using Iris Rd. from US-31 west to the private haul road, a distance of approx. 6400 lineal feet and the Consumers Power Co. shall furnish in writing, a guarantee of restoration to the road and the road surface during this grading period. 

THIS AGREEMENT made this 28th day of April , 1970, by and between GLEN HISSONG and wife, of Custer, Michigan, hereinafter referred to as the OWNERS and the Mason Count Road Commission of Scottville, Michigan, hereinafter referred to as the PURCHASER.

The OWNERS hereby grant to the PURCHASER the exclusive right to enter upon that part of the North Half of the NE_{+}^{\perp} of the SE_{+}^{\perp} , and the NE_{+}^{\perp} of the NW_{+}^{\perp} of the SE_{+}^{\perp} , in Section 3 T 18 N, R 16 W, in Custer Township, Mason County, Michigan, wherein there is deposited a certain indefinite amount of gravel and stone, to remove therefrom such gravel and stone as said Purchaser may see fit, subject to the provisions of this agreement, and said Purchaser shall maintain exclusive pit rights over any and all gravel and stone located or found upon the said premises with full rights of ingress and egress for the purpose of mining and removing the same.

Such privilege shall extend for a period of five years from the date of this agreem at which time the same shall automatically terminate.

The Purchaser agrees to perform all labor necessary for the removal of said gravel stone from the above-described premises, said Purchaser further agrees to pay the Owner at the rate of twenty-five cents (25¢) per cubic yard as consideration herein. It is further agreed by the parties hereto that the judgment and decision is said Purchaser respecting the exhaustion of said gravel and stone or the unmerchantab of the same shall be accepted by said Owners.

The Purchaser agrees to level up the pit area upon completion of the operation of gravei production and to level the pit site to the satisfaction of the OWNERS. The a said shall be done immediately upon completion of operations in the pit.


