Letter from Richard Weaver, Mason County Central Superintendent, was read pledging better cooperation in the above. Telephone calls have been received from Hal Madden and Mrs. June Newkirk indicating they two will cooperate.

Steve Bedker has been in asking for return to employment with Road Commission. He says Doctor has told him he can do any type work as long as he watches how he twists. He realizes his work record here at the Road Commission shows excessive absenteeism and he says willing to attend to work now. Road Commission not in favor of returning Steve Bedker to their employment.

Discussion about Fact Finder's report. Will discuss this at meeting with Attorney Claire.

Notices are in that Corp of Engineers has received applications for the placement of culverts under the Bridge Rehabilitation Program with the Board of Commissioners.

At 1008 A.M. Corliss Gulembo, supervisor of Sheridan Township, and Norm Hankins came into the meeting.

Gulembo said the snowplowing in his territory has not been good and the road north of the Townhall has not be n plowed for a week. Also, the banks someplaces are out in the road. A lady east of Benson Road on Decker is very sick and would like this road to be watched and kept passable. Would like Road Commission to check intersection at Taylor and Decker with the thought that Stop should be on the opposite road as it is now stopping traffic on a hill which causes cars to slide through intersection when slippery.

Discussion of heat in the truckroom. Jöhn Rozell has looked it over and given some figures on two styles of heaters. ONe with squirrel cage blower for approx \$850 and plain fanns for approx \$650. He is ready to do the work. He will get back to us with information on availablity. Commission Riisberg wishes to contact a supplier he knows who supplied the heaters in the shop.

Contingency Plan in case of a work stoppage was read.

After July 1, 1977 muck must be hauled away — cannot be used for side dressing. Road Commission will make decision at next meeting. Local Government people have been up this week to go over this project.

Minutes of last meeting on January 28th, 1977, read and approved as read.

Letter read rejecting Road Commission appplication for grant under Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Act of 1976, has been denied. This was for \$189,350 to complete soil erosion control structure program.

Letter from Coast Guard requesting Road Commission to apply for after the fact permits for the bridges over South and Middle Bayous of Hamlin Lake.

Results of hearing on L. Molyneux unimployment insurance case was read. Hearing referee threw out the waiting period.

Road Commission agrees Attorney Claire should contact the attorneys representing Burton Jones of Jones Pit and settle Novation to original Lease with the stipulation that Jones will be paid the 20¢ per cubic yard for gravel taken from the pit after he signs the Novation and nothing for gravel taken before he signs.

Motion by Lapenas and seconded by Riisberg, we authorize the Secretary to mark the Ballot "Yes" in the matter of an amendment to the Constitution and Bylaws of the County Road Association which reads as follows:— "Raise each existing service charge Classification rate in Article VII of the consitution, in the amount of thirty(30) percent for a period of two years beginning April 1, 1977, and ending March 31, 1979, with the rates reverting to the existing classification rates at the end of the two-year period."

Vote: - Riisberg and Lapenas yeas; nays- none. Motion carried.

The Road and Bridge committee of the Board of tommissioners came into the meeting at 10:45 AM. Present from this Committee were: Chairman Frank Morse and Members William Lehrbass as well as Jerome Rybicki.

Riisberg explained how Road Commission had had several samples of brine tested. Among them a sample from Miller Bros. operations in Victory Township. The sample from Miller Bros. compared favorably with a test of the material we are purchaseing. Miller Bros. will give Road Commission the brine, but it will take an estimated 15 to 20 thousand dollars to set up the tank and equipment necessary to operate Road Commission equipment from this source.

Discussion of Township projects completed during 1976. Total projects amounted to \$294,175.55 and of this Townships were billed for \$240,279.78. Of the above amounts were four miscellaneous jobs: City of Ludington, city of Scottville, Packaging Corp., and Susan Jorgensen paid toward the grading of a road in Logan Township.

Chairman Morse commented that he thought it would work much better if Townships could get their projects in a year ahead, so that money for this work, matching on the part of Road Commission, could be arranged for, as well as, more time for scheduling the work. Others agreed with this.

Chairman Morse discussed the proposed Board of Commissioners resolution allowing a Township to contract with the Road Commission for work to an amount to equal approximately what one mill of tax money for that township would amount to. This would not include Pere Marquette Charter Township.

Rybicki asked about what the townships owed the Road Commission and after this was discussed, questioned whether this resolution should state for new work.

Lehrbass agreed that this should be set up for new work.

Since this resolution was going to be presented by the Finance Committe, Morse, Rybicki, and Lehrbass discussed proposing an amendment to have it state for new work.

Chairman Morse asked about bridge program with Board of Commissioners. Two bridges one on Stephens Road and the other on Darr are completed except for the paving. Putting coldpatch in the corrugations of the metal decking has been discussed so that traffic can use them this winter and then in warmer weather do the final paving.

Applications have been made to the Corp of Engineers and the DNR for culverts in the Lincoln River, South Branch on Victory Corner Road and Lincoln River, North Branch on the Stephens Road. When Road Commission Engineers get all necessary permits, etc., the next step would be getting someone to do the project.

Lehrbass asked about Campbell Bridge. This has been discussed with the Local Government people of the State Highway Dept. and it appears a project can be set up to replace this crossing of the Walhalla Road. Tentative estimates call for a bridge in the price range of \$150,000. Road Commission participation under this proposal would be 25%.

Rybicki asked about the bridge that went down. The adjuster for the insurance company is working on this settlement and it is possible that in the near future something will come of these efforts. Road Commission Attorney is to contact insurance company attorneys for a conference over this settlement.

At 11:49 Chairman Morse left the meeting and Commissioners Rybicki and Lehrbass stayed to participate in the remainder of the Road Commission meeting.

At 11:50 A.M., William Cruise, of R. L. Scott Associates, Inc. came into the meeting to present resume of his company"s work with bridges, etc. in regard to Road Commission selecting a designer for the bridge across the South Branch of the Pere Marquette on the Walhalla Road.

Mr. Cruise gave a list of the various counties they have done work for and showed pictures of the various bridges that they had designed. He also mention that his company had designed the Bridge on the Pere Marquette on the Walhalla Road. He thought their fee would be in the neighborhood of \$7,000, but he would write a covering letter, so that Road Commission would have this information for next Frid ay.

It was explained that using plastic pipe the project was estimated in the neighborhood of \$8,000. Road Commission was ready to go on project as soon as 0.K. from Township and Board of Commissioners received.

Rybicki asked about perforated pipe. It was explained that the pipe was in the Road Commission yard and the project had been set up to take only the surface water from the intersection and carry to drainageway beyond Angling Road.

Morse and Rybicki expressed their approval for this project to come under Board of Commissioners program with Road Commission using the one mill formula.

Morse said his Committee is going to ask for more Revenue Sharing Funds for Road work. The cost of snow removal and ice control under Program with Board of Commissioners was discussed. This was work on weekends and Holidays. For the past winter, the total came to over \$55,000. This would be beyond the original \$47,000.

Rybicki explained that \$15,000 of anti-recession funds had been set up with the same stipulations as the original \$47,000. Anything left from this \$62,000 total could be used for other work that would not otherwise get done.

The Road Commission program for matching Township Funds for Road work during 1977 was gone over. This is mostly the same as 1976, except for two changes. One-estimated cost of "Prime and double seals" is now pegged at \$9,500 for Township share. Two-Road Commission will match up to \$2,000 limit of their funds with any one Township.

Morse asked what was happening on brine from Victory wells? The Miller Bros. people have been contacted. Road Commission waiting for reply from Jack Miller.

Lapenas asked about Committee's thoughts on the problem of buying seal coat aggregate from Western Concrete. This was discussed at some length.

"Tarp Law" was mentioned as trucks must now be loaded so that load is kept at least six inches below top of box or side boards unless a tarp is used to cover load.

Chairman Felty brought up the subject of per diem. Road Commission would like to be on same "per diem" as other Commissions and Committees of the County. They would not charge for regular meetings and special meetings of say 2 to 4 hours, but out-of-countmeetings should be re-imbursed. This might amount to 10-12 meetings per year. Consensus was Secretary should write this request to Chairman Eberback of the Officers and Salaries Committee before their next meeting.

The progress of the bridge program with Board of Commissioners was gone over. Con-

tractor is now ready to start replacing the deck on the Darr Road crossing of the South Branch of the Lincoln River. this will leave the paving of the Stephens Road Decker Road, Morse Road, and Darr Road(if finished in time) bridges to be ready for paving as soon as Laman Asphalt and Paving open their plant. This opening of plant is tentatively set at April 18th, weather permittin g.

The budget for 1977 was discussed. Reek Road(one mile) of grade drain, aggregate surface, and paving and Masten Road(two miles) of grade drain, aggregate surface are set up for Primary Road work, as well as the Bridge on the Walhalla Road crossing the South Branch of the Pere Marquette River. State Trunkline, County appropriations and estimated Township receipts were all figured into an estimated \$2,118,000 program. 

The Abels own property that abuts the Quarterline Road North of Johnson Road. This is just a trail through the brush and has been blocked on the south end. Is this a county road so that they can tell people interested in buying their land that it is access to the property? (Their property is the south 1/2 of the N 1/2 of the SW 1/4 of Section 10)

Chairman asked if road was in the County Road System. After investigation, this road is in the County certified system. He then explained that any construction work on this road would have to be financed partially by the Township or others.

Riisberg explained about how the right of way problems have multiplied along county roads and since this was not a well traveled road we would have to investigate the problems connected with improving it.

Road Commission agreed to look into the ingress and egress along Quarterline Road to the Abel property and get back to her.

Signed vouchers in the amount of \$85,845.61.

Communication from Attorney Claire relative to insurance company offer of \$8,500 as settlement on Campbell bridge. Road Commission agrees they would settle for \$18,000.

At 11:27 A.M. recessed for lunch.

Reconvened at office at 1:32 P.M. with Stan Bothwell and Ed Scott in attendance to discuss the portion of the plat of Oak Openings on the west side of Tallman Lake.

In answer to Chairman Felty's question Bothwell said they were here to find out what kind of specification Road Comm. required roads to be improved to before they would be taken into the County System and maintained by the Road Commission. These roads have a 33' right of way.

They explained they are collecting from the people of the plat to get finances to up-grade roads. The roads are being worked on a little at a time. Their big concern seemed to be snowplowing in the winter and the fact that no school buses will now come into the plat.

Bothwell said, "We cannot build them according to plat specifications in a 33' right of way. We were thinking of building them good, but narrower, say 21' top width. Minutes of last regular meeting on June 10th, 1977, read and approved as read.

Discussion about insurance. Fieldman has given some information, but still some lacking on boilers, etc.

Riisberg reported on trip taken to Kinchloe airbase. There are several snow-blowers that may be declared "surplus", but no decision as yet. He will be informed when this happens and then Road Commission will have to put in a bid if they are interested in obtaining one. One needed a new engine at an estimated cost of 7 to 8,000 dollars.

Riisberg reported has been contacted by a Jim Henry in regard to a drainage problem slong Scottville Road south of the bridge on the west side. This matter will be investigated.

Discussed Thames Estate preliminary plat. Road Commission required 25 foot radiuses on proposed intersection with Washington Avenue. Also more accurate profile showing more detail between Stations.

At 10:32 A.M. Supervisor Robert McDougall, Treasurer Otto Bogner, and Trustee John Tyndall of Logan Township came into the meeting to discuss road work.

McDougall said they would like estimate on cutting the sharp hill down on Anthony Road, west of the Townhall. There were several things to consider. 1. The pine tree at the trailer house on the south side must be saved. 2. Consideration of how much right of way needed and the driveway on the Robert Rhine property.

Logan people will contact R. Rhine about right of way at his property.

Bogner asked about getting some type sign to warn people about barricade on Kinney and Walhalla Roads.

Discussed snowplowing in Whiskey Wilds Subdivision.

Bogner said would money. Township pay \$1600.00 and Board of Commissioners be billed for the remaining \$1022.15.

At 11:25 A.M. Logan Township people out and Supervisor Knizacky and Trustee Edmund Rybicki came into the meeting to discuss road work.

Knizacky asked about getting Hoague Road from Custer Road to Stephens and then up to County Line and across to Campbell into the Primary Road system. He said lots of new building and a large increase in traffic. This would also connect with a present primary system at the intersection of two primary roads—Riverside Drive Campbell Road.

He filed a letter from the Freesoil Board stating above and also that many use this

as a short cut to get to M-55. The traffic count is 429 average daily this year whil four years ago the average daily was 36. (This count was taken on Memorial Day weekend and showed 1906 for  $95\frac{1}{2}$  hours. It was adjusted)

Knizacky will talk to the Supervisor of Meade Township and ask them to also put in request for this Primary change. They will discuss whether to go ahead with Hoague Road or wait to see what comes of request to change to Primary System.

Road Commission will get in touch with Local Government Division of State Hwy. Dept. to get their thoughts on this change.

At 12:15 P.M. Freesoil Township people out and William Johnson of Perla Stout in to discuss bridge program, etc.

Johnson first phase the five bridges were inspected and needed just a couple minor things done to complete that part of the program with the Board of Commissioners. They will send us a statement on what percentage of contractor's billing to pay. 10% held back for possibly 30 days.

Stephens Road Crossing all set to go as far as permits, etc needed. Understands Road Commission forces to do this. The other two left- DNR tells him all drawings calculations, etc. will be O.K. with the submission for a larger culvert pipe and then very short time they will be able to give their approval or disapproval.

Bridges must be inspected every two years. It would help both Mason County and the State of Michigan if the local bridges were put on computer cards so that State would have record of condition of Local Road Bridges in Mason County. Would Road Commission want him to go ahead and furnish state this information? Cost would be about \$75 apiece for the 22 bridges or \$1650.

He will furnish a report on this same as on the 11 primary bridges that he inspected The local bridges have also been inspected, but not put on computer cards as Primary Bridges were.

Pere Marquette Township is to be contacted to see if they will agree to financing this Stop and Go lite.

Mr. Gotthile Gren-c has 50 A. of gravel for sale north of Gillespi Pit in Lake County on Route No. 669. Road Commission feels they now own Kerschner Pit, which hasnot been worked much and the gravel lease on Jones Pit, so they are not interested at the present time.

Discussion about brine from Victory oil field. Lowrie of Miller Bros. will be contacted to see if arrangements can be made to set up tank, etc. for getting this brine.

Request to move a M48A5 tank from Manistee to Ludington on August 7, 1977. This would be on display at the Fair. Road Commission feels that tank should be moved on the route shown as coming down U.S. 31 and not on Quarterline and Stiles the other route shown. This because of the possibility of tearing up the blacktop surface during hot weather.

Letter read from Jim Schulte of West Shore Security & Patrol Service stating that they would patrol property from 10:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. for \$50.00 per month. would be hourly checks. They would also make other arrangements, if desired. Commission not interested at present time.

Lapenas gave report on meeting he had had with Jim Henry on drainage on west side of Scottville Road south of the Pere Marquette River.

Letter read from Bruce A. Conradson, Traffic and Safety Engineer of the Mich. State Hwy. Dept. stating that estimate for the new Stop and go signal at US-10 and Jebavy Road is \$3448.00 for installation and \$238.00 annually for continuing maintenance. The above estimate is Road Commission share of this cost. Agreement was enclosed for signatures. signal installation to follow construction which is now scheduled to be let in October of this year.

Past history of this type installation shows that Branch township was the only one found to have paid a portion(50%) of the installation costs, but several townships and Village of Custrer were at one time billed for portions of the maintenance cost. the portions being the Road Commission percentage.

At 10:31 A.M. Supervisor Corliss Gulembo came into the meeting to discuss road work.

Gulembo asked about specifications for road that is being worked on in Oak Openings on west side of Tallman Lake. Mr. Bothwell had contacted him about this.



Minutes of last regular meeting on August 12, 1977, read and approved as read.

At 10:15 A. M., Mrs. Chas. Sheeley and Mrs. Norman Raske came into the meeting. Ladies do not want access to Gunn Lake shut off. they have heard there is interest in closing dedicated streets that run to the lake. They are primarily interested in Oshegun Lane. At register of Deeds they were told a street in this area of Indian Hills Plat had been closed. Secretary read from minutes the street closed was Wawonaisa Lanes.

At 10:31 A.M. The Ladies left the meeting and Tim Hansen, Mason County Drain Commissioner and members of the Road and Bridges Committee, of the Mason County Board of Commissioners, Jerome Rybicki and Frank Morse, came into the meeting.

Chairman of the Road and Bridges Committee Frank Morse said he had been told a crane and two trucks of the Road Commission had been sitting by the road doing nothing for two hours.

Manager explained that couldn't know for sure, since no time or area was mentioned, but there had been times when the Drott and truck or trucks were sent out to install a culvert. The call had been made to "Miss Digg" three days before, but when the crew got to the project, the telephone lines had still not been marked to they had to call in, someone at the garage called the telephone company and a hour or so, later a man would come out to mark the line. Drain Commissioner explained the program that had been set up with Board of Commissioners for his office and Road Commission cooperating and doing some cleaning of County Drains along the road. Road Commission will be paid 100% of costs from the fund(approx \$6,000) set up by the County Board. He wanted to know about Road Commission feelings of going farther off the road than the right-of-way in specific cases where a little extra work would relieve a potential water pocket.

Road Commission is interested in doing this work and agrees that Drain Commissioner and Manager can set up areas where some ditching beyond the right of way would cure water This to be a reasonable distance.

Hansen said he would like to do the drain north of Scottville first and then possibly there were some Road Commission would like work done on. He was hoping to get help

Also, estimate per cubic yard includes striking off the sand and any overhead charges.

Morse said there will be in addition to the money set up for cooperative projects with Drain Commissioner, \$10,000 for maintenance work on Local Roads. When asked if this might be used to seal the Bradshaw and Inman Roads to the County Landfill, the two members of the Road and Bridges Committee indicated they had no objection. (This because Pere Marquette Township had returned the above projects because of the excess traffic on these roads generated by those going to the landfill which is county-wide traffic).


